Witherington, of Tazewell, fought to have an appropriate committee on the method of conducting elections, how often and when they shall be held, but he was defeated, and all the committees on state trade are to consist of two from each Congressional district and two from the State at large. The other committees will be composed of from eleven to fifteen members, and at least one will come from each district. Eleven pages were provided for at two dollars per day, to be taken from each district and the Republican.
