## Radford Normal Notes

The Fifth Annual Educational Conference opens at the Normal School at Radford today. The opening address will be delivered by Dr. J. L. McBrien, former State Superintendent of Schools in Nebraska and now Specialist in Rural Education in the United States Bureau of Education at Washington, D. C. A number of prominent educators of the State and Nation have places on the program for Friday and Saturday.

Dr. C. A. McMurry, noted educator and author, and now Professor of Elementary Education at Peabody College at Nashville, Tenn., will deliver a course of lectures at the Normal School in July. Dr. J. L. McBrien will also deliver a series of lectures on Teachers' Training before the Summer Normal in July.

The work of the Co-operative Education Association, of which Mr. J. H. Montgomery of Richmond, is Secretary, will be presented by a course of lectures and illustrated lantern slides during the Summer Quarter. Prof. W. E. Gilbert, Secretary of the Appalachian School Improvement Foundation and one of the District Chairmen of the Co-operative Education Association, is giving much attention to the development of the spirit of co-operation of communities with schools throughout the State. The work of these various citizens' organizations was very fully presented at the Educational Conference at Radford on Saturday, March 16.

## Are Not Calling For Certain Tax Forms

Collector of Internal Revenue John M. Hart, of Roanoke, Va., reports that he has received very few calls for Forms 1099 and 1096. As these forms will probably be needed by more people than any other forms it is likely that the tax payers have had no information as to their use. All individuals, partnerships and corporations who have paid during the calendar year 1917 \$800, or more, to any other individual, partnership, or corporation for salaries, wages, fees, commission, rents, interest, premiums or annuities, must make a return to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Washington, D. C., on Forms 1099 and 1096. Full instructions are on the forms which can be obtained by writing Mr. Hart at the above address.

## Virginia Leads South

Washington, March 16.—Ex-act subscriptions by States to the second Liberty loan, tabulated and made public by the Treasury, show that New York State led all others with \$1,413,045,800. Pennsylvania was second, with \$497,372,500.

Subscriptions by Southern States including North Carolina, \$17,921,750; Tennessee, \$31,591,950; Virginia, \$51,373,250.
