The common council today approved the promotion of Arthur W. Mierow, in charge of the city hall police detail, from captain to inspector, thus eliminating the only captaincy in the department.

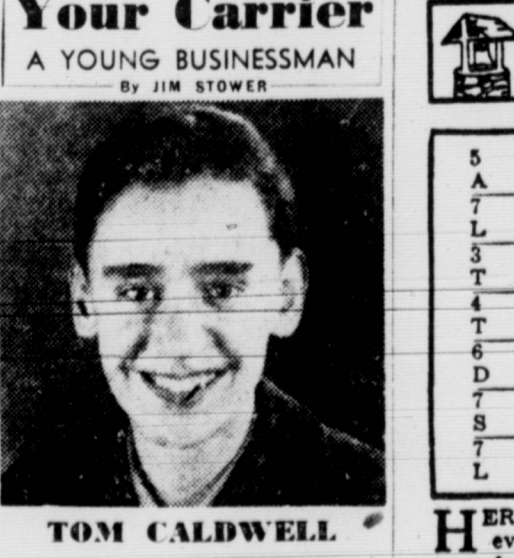
