The official returns on the crops throughout Hungary show that the harvest does not exceed the average. It is equal to that of 1894, and in quality the crops are generally good.

A treaty has been concluded between Greece and Russia by which a fixed import duty been determined upon for Russian cereals and by which Russia is given the monopoly of importing kerosene into Greece.

Advices received from the vicinity of Berbera, East Africa, say that the English expedition (supposed to be that of Dr. Donaldson Smith, of Philadelphia) has defeated the Rebare tribe, which has been harrying caravans.

The emperor of Austria will arrive in England about the end of August, and it is expected that he will spend three weeks deer stalking in the Highlands as the guest of the queen. It will be his first visit to Great Britain.

Twenty-five houses have been destroyed and fifty-nine badly damaged by the sinking of the earth at Bruex, Bohemia. Nearly twenty-five hundred persons have been turned out of their homes, for it is feared that other houses will collapse.

It is officially announced that Queen Victoria has approved the appointment of General Lord Roberts to the command of her majesty's forces in Ireland. The Earl of Cadogan, the new Viceroy of Ireland, made his state entry into Dublin on August 2.

A despatch from Tangiers reports that the situation near Saffi, Morocco, where a German named Rockstrop was murdered, is extremely critical. The town is besieged by rebellious Bedouin tribes. Some rebels tried to escape from prison. A fight ensued and several were killed. The governor has distributed rifles among the European residents.

The pope has addressed an encyclical letter to the bishops of Belgium, urging them to aim at ameliorating the strained relations existing in that country between capital and labor by conciliating the respective interests. The pope concludes his letter by calling on Catholics to oppose strenuously the perverse theories of socialism, which, he says, directs all its efforts against religion.

The London Times prints a Havana despatch saying that according to information from insurgent sources, General Campos' force was destroyed in the battle near Bayamo. General Campos and a half dozen others of his best mounted officers alone escaped. General Campos was wounded. The report of the capture of Antonio Maceo, the insurgent chief, according to the same authority, is not true.

The Vienna Freudenblatt learns that the foreign agents at Sofia will present an energetic protest to the Bulgarian government because of the failure of the Bulgarian officials to protect the agents and their wives against brutality and insult on the occasion of the funeral of Stambuloff.

The suffering of the negro colonists in the State Chihuahua, Mexico, are to be inquired into. The United States government asked that Mexico investigate the reports, and on Monday a Mexican commission arrived at Mapimi, a station on the Mexican Central, south of Chihuahua city, authorized to proceed to the colony to investigate. At the station was nearly a hundred starving negroes from the Ellis colony.

The Cuban rebels under Victoriano Garcia and the Spaniards under General Garcia Navarro had an encounter at El Avispero, sixteen miles from Santiago de Cuba, on July 9. The Spaniards were defeated as the position taken by the Cubans was most advantageous. They could fire directly on the government troops, and it was almost impossible for the soldiers to reach them. Of the Spaniards twenty-five were killed and one hundred and twenty-four wounded.

The latest news concerning the English elections shows that the Conservatives are still gaining seats.
