

Motion by Mr. W. F. Brown—Resolved, that the ordinance adopted October 7, 1919, relative to lawful fences and providing for the impounding and sale of certain animals, be amended so as to permit dogs to roam at large in the following territory, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on Bayou Rouge, where the section line between Sections 26 and 27, Township 3 South, Range 5 East, intersects Bayou Rouge and running south along said section line to Bayou Petite Prairie, thence southeast along Bayou Petite Prairie to the source of Dry Bayou, thence west along Dry Bayou to the range line between Range 4 and 5, east, thence south along said range line to Bayou Waxia, and thence southeast along Bayou Waxia to the source of Bayou Sackett; thence southeast along Bayou Sackett to the Opelousas, Gulf and Northeastern Railroad; thence west along the O., G. & N. E. R. R. to the section line between Sections 34 and 35, Township 5 South, Range 5 East; thence south along said section line to the Bayou Courtaubieu; thence east along the Bayou Courtaubieu to where the line between the properties of Dr. J. P. Saitan, Futral and Courville intersects said Bayou Courtaubieu on south side, and thence south along said property line to the New Orleans, Texas and Mexico Railroad; thence east along the N. O., T. and M. R. R. to the Bayou Courtaubieu; thence southeast along Bayou Courtaubieu to the range line between Range 6 and 7, East, and thence north along said range line to the north line of Township 4 S. R. 6, East; thence west along this township line between Townships 3 and 4 to the south corner of Section 33, T. 3 S. R. 6, East; thence north along section line between Sections 33 and 34 to Bayou Rouge, and thence northwest along Bayou Rouge to the point of beginning.

Mr. W. F. Brown offered the following ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, in regular session convened:

Section 1.—That in all districts where, by resolution of this parish, dogs are permitted to run at large, the owner or owners of said dogs, are required to first ring their nose with at least three substantial rings, or properly clip their nose, before said animals are permitted to run at large.

Section 2.—That the ward constable or any citizen shall cause to be taken up all dogs running at large in those districts where the owner or owners have failed to comply with the provisions of Section One (1) of this ordinance, or whenever any dog or dogs are found damaging the public roads, they shall also be taken up by any citizen or ward constable and be disposed of as provided for in Section Two (2) of an ordinance adopted by this body on October 7, 1919.

Ordinance adopted.

Mr. R. L. Mills offered the following ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE

Whereas, election was held in Road District No. Eleven (11) of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, on the 17th day of June, 1919, in pursuance to an ordinance of the Police Jury adopted on the 4th day of May, 1919, notice of which was published according to law; and

Whereas, one of the questions submitted at said election was to determine the proposition:

"To incur debt and to issue serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District to the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), to be paid in five (5) years, interest payable semi-annually at the rate of Five (5) per cent per annum, for the purpose of constructing permanent roads and bridges in said Road District; and

Whereas, said proposition was lawfully carried at said election as shown by the process verbal of the Police Jury canvassing the returns of said election on the seventh day of July, 1919; and

Whereas, the result of said election was duly promulgated on the seventh day of July, 1919, as required by law, and no contest has been filed notwithstanding more than sixty days have elapsed since the date of said promulgation; and

Whereas, the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry is recognized by the constitution and laws of this state to be the governing authority of said Road District; now, therefore

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, in regular and lawful session convened:

Section 1.—That the president and clerk of this Police Jury shall be and are hereby authorized for and on behalf of Road District No. Eleven (11) of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to incur debt to the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), and to make and sign serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District therefor, numbered consecutively from One (1) to Five Hundred (500), both inclusive, due on the first day of July, 1920, and the last of which shall mature on the first day of July, 1924; and which shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually, from date, with interest coupons attached to each bond; and said bonds shall not be sold for less than par.

Section 2.—That the proceeds of said bond issue, when negotiated, shall be deposited in the treasury of said parish, and there shall be and remain as a trust fund to be

used only for the purpose for which the same were raised as set forth in the preamble hereof.

Section 3.—That said bonds shall be of date the first day of July, 1919, and shall begin to mature on the first day of July, A. D. 1920, and shall become due and payable each year thereafter until and including the first day of July, A. D. 1924, and shall be in numbers and amounts as follows:
