WRECK ON G. C. L. DELAYS TRAFFIC

SWITCH ENGINE DERAILED ON INCLINE AT ANCHORAGE ON LAST MONDAY

A big switch engine was derailed on the river incline of the Gulf Coast Lines at Anchorage last Monday, going deep in the river mud, and as a consequence the westbound passenger train, due in Opelousas at 12:45 p. m., was several hours late. It required the work of the wrecking crew and the big crane to lift the monster from its resting place, and clearing the tracks so that trains could be placed on the transfer steamer. The work, however, was completed in record time and the eastbound train, No. 4, went through to New Orleans on time.

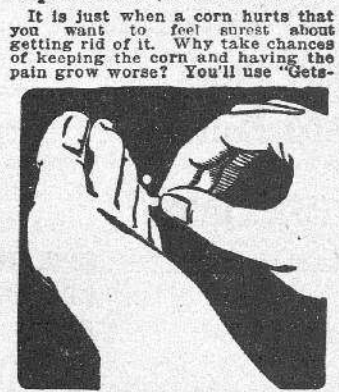
