## School Board Proceedings.

Franklinton, La., Feb. 16, 1921.

On the above date the Washington Parish School Board met in special session in the town of Franklinton as per notice of President Bateman. The meeting was called to order by the President and led in prayer by Mr. Geo. C. Knight.

The following members were in attendance: D. Wallace, O. E. Morris, F. B. Bateman, L. T. Richardson, D. T. Cushing, Geo. C. Knight, G. W. Knight, J. A. Moore, J. H. Mitchell and Willie Fussell. Absent—J. K. Johnson.

On motion duly seconded and carried, the motion adopted at a special meeting of this Board held on January 26th authorizing a 15 per cent reduction in teachers' salaries on and after February 1, 1921, is hereby rescinded.

On motion duly seconded and carried a reduction of five per cent in the length of term of each white school in the Parish not including the City Schools of Bogalusa is hereby made. Said reduction making the length of session for the High Schools 171 days instead of 180 and all of the other schools 133 days instead of 140 days.

On motion duly seconded and carried the Secretary and President are hereby authorized to pay incidental and miscellaneous expense bills after same have been properly approved. The total of said bills not to exceed \$500.00.

On motion duly seconded and carried the Superintendent is hereby requested to furnish each member of the Board with quarterly statements.

The Board stood adjourned to meet in special or regular session upon receipt of notice from the President.
