AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE BANK OF WEST FELICIANA.

State of Louisiana, Parish of West Feliciana.

Before me, Eugene S. Muse, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified, in and for the Parish of West Feliciana, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared Samuel McC. Lawrason, president, and J. Revill Matthews, vice president of the Bank of West Feliciana, residents of St. Francisville, Parish of West Feliciana, State of Louisiana, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and also president and secretary respectively of a meeting of the stockholders of said Bank, held on the 6th day of February, 1913, herein appearing and acting under and virtue of certain resolutions adopted at said meeting, a duly certified copy of which resolutions, being hereto annexed and made part hereof, for reference, who declared that pursuant to call and in accordance with the notices issued by the president and Board of Directors of the Bank of West Feliciana, a meeting of the stockholders of said corporation was held on said 6th day of February, 1913, for the purpose of considering and passing upon certain amendments to the Charter of said Corporation, for the purpose of increasing its Capital Stock, adding a Trust Banking Business, and changing the name of the corporation, and in compliance with the provisions of the Charter and the law for the holding of said meetings, and after forty (40) days previous notice by mail and thirty (30) days notice by publication in The True Democrat, a newspaper published in the town of St. Francisville, Parish of West Feliciana, Louisiana, said meeting of the stockholders of said corporation was held on said 6th day of February, 1913, whereat three hundred and fifty-six (356) shares were present and represented, being more than two-thirds (2-3) of the Capital Stock of said Bank, and after all the formalities of the laws of this State and of the charter of this said corporation had been complied with, all of said shares present and represented at said meeting voted to revise and amend the charter of this corporation, and instructed the president and vice president of the Bank of West Feliciana,

and respectively chairman and secretary of said meeting of stockholders, to appear before a Notary Public, and publicly declare the amendments and additions to said charter, in accordance with the resolutions amending same adopted at said meeting, by increasing the capital stock to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), represented by one thousand (1000) shares of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each, and adding a Trust Banking Business to the General Banking Business of the Corporation, and changing the name of the corporation to the Feliciana Bank and Trust Company.

Now, therefore, in order to carry out the objects and purposes of said meeting of stockholders as declared in said resolution adopted at their meeting, and in order to carry out the foregoing amendments to the charter and to clothe same in proper form, the said parties formally declare and make known the following amendments to the charter of said Bank of West Feliciana, as follows, to-wit:

Article Six of the Charter is hereby declared to be amended to read: "The capital stock of this corporation is fixed at one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), divided into one thousand (1000) shares of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each."

Article One of the charter of the corporation is amended to read: "The name of this corporation shall be the Feliciana Bank and Trust Company, with its domicile in the town of St. Francisville, Parish of West Feliciana, State of Louisiana."

And in addition to doing a general banking business under the laws of the State of Louisiana, this corporation accepts the provisions of Act No. 45 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Louisiana of 1902, as amended by Act No. 121 and Act No. 238 of 1910, and is authorized and empowered to do a Trust Banking Business, in addition to the other general banking business of the Bank, with power to accept trust or agency of any and every description which may be committed or transferred with their consent to it, by any person or persons or business corporation, board or body, public or private, whomsoever, or by any court of the State of Louisiana or of the United States of America, or any one of the United States, with power and authority to be appointed by any person or by any court of this State, or

by any court of the United States, Executor, Administrator, Syndic, Receiver, Curator, Tutor, Trustee, or Assignee, in the same manner and to the same extent and under the same conditions that any natural persons may be so appointed. And with all powers conferred under said Act No. 45 of 1902, as amended on Trust Banking Corporations.

Thus done and passed at my office in the town of St. Francisville, Parish of West Feliciana, State of Louisiana, on this 19th day of the month of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the presence of W. H. Buquoi, and D. I. Norwood, competent witnesses, who sign these presents with said appearers and me, said Notary, after due reading of the whole.

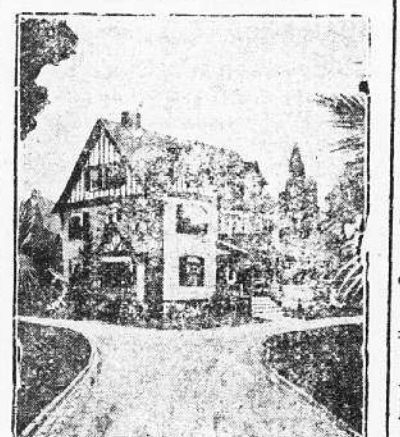
