STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF CALCASIEU. }
Be it known, that on this second day of September, A. D. 1903, before the undersigned duly commissioned and qualified Notary Public, in and for the State and Parish aforesaid, personally came and appeared E. F. Walker and E. P. Shear, President and Secretary respectively of the E. F. Walker Dry Goods Company, Limited, a corporation organized and chartered under the laws of the State of Louisiana, with its domicile and principal place of business in the town of Jennings, State and Parish aforesaid, who declared to me that a meeting of the stockholders of said corporation, held at its office in Jennings, on the second day of September, A. D. 1903, at which meeting over three-fourths of the capital stock of said corporation was represented, in person and by proxy, the following resolution was unanimously adopted and made a part of the record of said meeting, to-wit:
"Resolved, That the charter of the E. F. Walker Dry Goods Company, Limited, be and is hereby amended, changed and altered, in the following manner, to-wit: Article number five (5), to read: Each director of said corporation shall be the holder in his own name of not less than (1) share of the capital stock thereof, instead of not less than five (5), as said charter now indicates; and said board of directors shall be composed of not less than nine (9) nor more than eleven (11) stockholders, who shall be elected on the first Tuesday of January of each year, or at any meeting specially called for that purpose. Instead of as said charter now reads, the following stockholders being hereby added to the board of directors, to-wit: E. F. Walker, President, E. P. Shear, Secretary, C. R. Cline, M. H. Adams, U. S. Phillips, A. C. Wilkins, and Geo. Hathaway.
Article six (6) shall be, and is hereby amended, changed and altered, to read that the office of Secretary and Treasurer of said corporation 'MAY' be held by the same person, instead of 'SHALL' be held by the same person, and the manager of said corporation may be elected by the board of directors and shall not necessarily be the President of said corporation.
Article nine (9) shall be, and is hereby amended, changed and altered, to read: 'This charter may be changed, modified or altered, with the consent of three-fourths of the capital stock of the corporation, represented and voting at any general meeting of the stockholders, convened for that purpose, instead of as said article now specifies.
Wherefore, said appearers, acting in their said official capacities for said corporation, do hereby declare and direct, that by this act, said amendments shall, from the date hereof, have the full effect of revoking and superceding all articles or parts of articles in conflict therewith.
