OFFICIAL MINUTES OF PARISH POLICE JURY.

Jennings, La., May 5th, 1921.
The Police Jury of the Parish
of Jefferson Davis, State of Loui-
siana, met in regular session at
the Court House in Jennings, La.,
in this day at nine o'clock a. m.

The meeting was called to order
by Honorable C. E. Carr, presi-
dent, and upon roll call the fol-

The minutes of the regular ses-
sion held on April 7th, 1921 were

A communication was read
from the State Board of Health
upon the matter of sanitation of
the Court House and Jail; Mr.
Krielow moved that the Sheriff be
directed to properly screen the
Jail, and scrub the floors and
Cells. The motion was seconded
by Mr. Davis and upon being put
was carried.

The noon hour having arrived
Mr. Marcantel moved that the
Police Jury adjourn for noon un-
til 1:30 p. m. The motion was se-
conded by Mr. Davis and upon be-
ing put was carried.

Afternoon Session

The Police Jury reconvened at
1:30 p. m. with the same members
present as in the forenoon session.

Resolution

Whereas, the District Attorney's
office has advised this body that
because of the demand upon him
in the Courts and other matters
connected with his official duties
also, he is precluded from acting
for this body in the matter of
special service in connection the
following mentioned matter: S.

Duplex Broussard vs No. 1566 Jeffer-
son Davis Parish, et als.

Whereas, a real necessity in the
opinion of this body now exists
for the appointment of special
counsel for the purpose of repre-
senting this body in the above
mentioned matter, the same being
necessary for the benefit of the
public.

Now therefore, be it resolved
that Honorable J. H. Heinen, At-
torney at Law, of Jennings, Loui-
siana, be and he is hereby retain-
ed as Special counsel for this
Police Jury in this particular mat-
ter and that his compensation for
services to be rendered in said
matter be fixed at the sum of Two
Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars,
which fee is fixed as compensation
for trial in the District Court, and
that the said compensation be paid
from the contingent fund.

The above resolution was in-
troduced by Mr. St. Germain who
moved that the same be adopted.
The motion was seconded by Mr.
Krielow and upon being put was
carried.
