## CHARTER.

STATE OF LOUISIANA  
PARISH OF ST. MARTIN

Be it known that on this 13th day of July A. D. 1908, Before me the undersigned Notary Public, in and for the Parish of St. Martin, State of Louisiana, and duly commissioned and qualified.

Personally came and appeared E. Guidroz & als who declared unto me, Notary, in presence of the witnesses herein-after named and undersigned, that desiring to avail themselves of the laws of this State, relative to organization of Corporations, and to acquire the rights, and privileges of a Body Corporate, they do form themselves into a Corporation under the name and style, and for the purposes hereinafter set forth to-wit:

### ARTICLE I.

The name of this Corporation shall be GUIDROZ OIL COMPANY its domiciled is hereby established at Breaux Bridge, Parish of St. Martin, Louisiana; and under its Corporate name, said Corporation shall have the power to contract, sue and be sued, to make, use a Corporate Seal, and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to hold, received, purchase, mortgage or convey under the said Corporate name Real and Personal Property; to name and appoint such officers, directors, agents, managers, and employees as the interest or convenience of said Corporation may require; to make and establish by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management of its affairs, and the same to change and alter at pleasure; and to do all other acts and things permitted by law and as shall be necessary to carry out the objects and purposes of the said Corporation.

Said Corporation unless sooner dissolved shall exist for a period of thirty years from date; The President or in his absence the Secretary any Treasurer, shall be the proper person upon whom Citation or other legal process shall be served.

### ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this Corporation is organized and the nature of its business to be carried on, are hereby declared to be to engage in the business of drilling upon or otherwise exploiting such lands as it may acquire in full or part ownership or to which it may acquire any rights whatever for the purpose of discovering oil, gas, or minerals; and the same to explore and develop for commercial purposes; to undertake all works and make all contracts to that end; and such product as it may bring forth to sell or otherwise dispose of; to make all such works or enterprises as may facilitate such drilling and explorations, the storing of products, the sale and delivery thereof, and in fine, to do all things necessary or convenient for the benefit and good of this enterprise.

### ARTICLE III.

The Capital Stock shall be Ten Thousand Dollars, divided in shares of one hundred Dollars each; which stock shall be paid in cash at the time of subscription or of its issuance, at not less than par. Stocks may be issued in exchange for property or rights transferred to the Corporation or for such other valuable consideration or services rendered as may be determined by the Board of Directors, provided that the Stocks so issued shall be clearly equal to the consideration thereof, and provided that no stock shall be issued until the consideration thereof shall have been received by the Corporation. No Stockholder shall sell his stock until after fifteen days notice of his intention to sell be given to the Company, and the Stockholders shall have the first privilege of purchasing the same; no transfer shall be made without the proper entry thereof upon the Stock Book of the Company. This Corporation shall commence doing business as soon as Five thousand Dollars of the Capital Stock shall have been subscribed. The Directors shall have the right to determine how much additional stock shall be issued.

### ARTICLE IV.

The Corporate powers of this Company shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Five Directors; three of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and their decisions shall be valid corporate acts. There shall be elected from these a President, and a Secretary and Treasurer. The Board of Directors shall be elected on the First Monday of January of each year. Until the election of nineteen hundred and nine, the following shall constitute the first Board of Directors: Evans Guidroz, and D. P. Martin, and W. H. Mackenzie and James W. Counts and Claude C. Martin and until such time Evans Guidroz shall be President and Claude C. Martin Vice-President and W. H. Mackenzie Secretary and D. P. Martin shall be Treasurer and James W. Counts Manager. At every election and meeting of Stockholders, each stockholder shall be entitled to

one vote for each share of stock registered in his name, and may vote by proxy.

### ARTICLE V.

The Board of Directors shall have power to fill vacancies in their number caused by death, resignation or otherwise, from among the stockholders of this Corporation. The said Board shall have full control of the property of this Company, and shall so conduct, manage, and use the same as in their discretion they deem fit and that is consistent with the objects of this Company or the welfare of the same. It may adopt such rules and regulations as the affairs of the Corporation may require, employ such service, Clerks, or other Agents as it may appear desirable, to fix and determine the salaries of officers and other employees herein provided for.

### ARTICLE VI.

This Charter may be changed, or amended, the stock increased or decreased or the Corporation dissolved at a General meeting or the Stockholders convened for the purpose with the assent of three fourths of the entire stock issue whether present or represented at such meeting. Thirty days prior notice of such meeting shall be given in any newspaper published in St. Martin Parish, La. Notice shall likewise be given in writing. In case of dissolution of this Corporation, the Liquidation of the affairs shall be conducted by three Commissioners selected from the Stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose as above set forth in this Article. Said Commissioners shall remain in office until the final liquidation. In case of the death of one or more of such Commissioners, the survivors shall continue to act.

### ARTICLE VII.

No Stockholders of this Corporation shall be liable for the contracts or faults thereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the Company on the shares of stock subscribed or owned by him; nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this Charter or of exposing Stockholders to any liability beyond the unpaid balance, if any, of his stock.
