## Parish Committee Meets.

Headquarters Parish Democratic Committee, Parish of Lafourche.

At a meeting of the Parish Democratic Committee held at the Court House of Lafourche Parish on Oct. 25th, 1911 the following resolution was unanimously adopted:—

Whereas at a meeting of the Parish Democratic Committee of the Parish of Lafourche held on the 13th day of October 1911, it was provided that a Primary Election be held throughout the parish of Lafourche and the several Wards thereof to select candidates for Parish offices for the Parish of Lafourche, State of Louisiana, to-wit: Sheriff, Assessor, Clerk of Court, Coroner, Two members of the General Assembly in the lower House, Justices of the Peace for the respective wards, Police Jurors and members of the Democratic Committee for the respective Wards and five members of said Committee at large in the Parish, said Primary Election to be held on the 23rd day of January 1912, the nominees at said Election to be voted on at the General Election to be held in said Parish and Wards on the 16th day of April 1912.

And Whereas, it was provided further that in the event that but one duly qualified elector shall have announced and declared his intention to become a candidate for any of the offices herein enumerated in the cases where only one officer should be elected, and two duly qualified elector or more in cases where more than one should be elected, by the 23rd day of October 1911, in the manner and form provided in Act No. 49 of 1906 and subsequent amendments thereto and the Resolution of this Committee that this Committee be authorized to declare said person or persons the nominee or nominees of the Democratic party for said office or offices.

And Whereas it appears by the records of the said Committee and the report of the Chairman thereof that J. Louis Aucoin of the Parish of Lafourche is the only duly qualified elector who has complied with the laws of this State relative to nominations on behalf of the Democratic Party as candidate for the office of Clerk of Court of the Parish of Lafourche, and whereas it appears likewise that Dr. Albert J. Meyer of Thibodaux, Parish of Lafourche, is the only duly qualified elector who has complied with the said laws as Coroner of the Parish of Lafourche.

And whereas it appears by the records and the report of the Chairman of said Committee that J. L. Basset of the First Ward of the Parish of Lafourche and L. C. And Whereas it appears by the records of this Committee that Oscar J. Mire, of the First Ward, of said Parish, and H. P. Morvant of the Fourth Ward of said Parish, and F. H. Toups, of the Fifth Ward of the Parish are the only duly qualified electors who have complied with the laws of this State relative to nominations on behalf of the Democratic party as candidates for the office of Constables in and for their respective Wards in the Parish of Lafourche.

And whereas it appears by the records of this Committee that Camille Naquin, and Thomas J. Pierson, of the Second Ward of said Parish; and Willie T. Barrios and Adam Bellanger of the Fourth Ward of said Parish; and J. Arthur Blouin and Joseph E. Weldon of the Seventh Ward of said Parish; and Ed. Reggio and William Cluice of the Eighth Ward of said Parish; and F. D. Ditchett and Gillis Foret of the Ninth Ward of said Parish; and A. L. Deramee and Lubin Mire of the Tenth Ward of said Parish are the only duly qualified electors who have complied with the laws of this State relative to nominations on behalf of the Democratic Party as candidates for the office of members of the Parish Democratic Committee in and for their respective wards in the Parish of Lafourche.

Therefore be it resolved by the Parish Democratic Committee of the Parish of Lafourche that J. Louis Aucoin, of Thibodaux, in the Parish of Lafourche, be and is hereby declared to be the nominee of the Democratic Party as Clerk of Court of the Parish of Lafourche to be voted for at the general election to be held April 16th, 1912.
