Claims in Regard to the Arbitration of the Claims.

Rome, Dec. 26.—The only conditions which Italy has attached to her acceptance of arbitration of the Venezuelan difficulties are that all points in dispute shall be submitted to the arbitrators, so that no question shall be left undecided, and that Italian claims must be considered on an equality with those of other powers.

CATHOLIC.

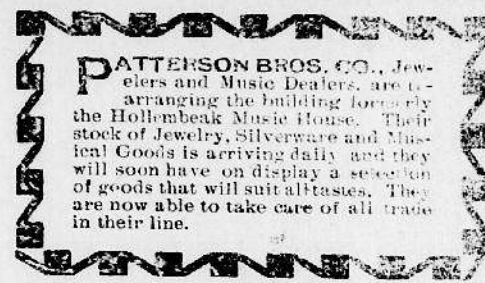
The Catholic church was decorated in a becoming manner, and a crib, giving an imitation of the manger, was arranged in the left hand corner of the church.
