

A SENSATIONAL SUICIDE.

A special to the N. O. Picayune from Summit, Miss., of a recent date says: At Holmesville, a little village fourteen miles southwest of here, Geo. Quinn waylaid his sweetheart, Miss Dora Thomas, and fired at her, the ball striking her hand and passing through it. She fainted on the spot and Quinn left her, as he thought, dead. His house was only a quarter of a mile distant, and in a few moments a second shot was heard, and when the neighbors rushed in they found him lying lifeless on the floor, with a bullet-hole through the head, and the pistol at his side told the tale. Miss Thomas soon regained consciousness and was taken to her parents' home, a few hundred yards away. She says Quinn emerged from the bushes and without saying a word leveled the pistol, at which she threw up her hands and begged for mercy. The shot was evidently aimed at her head.

Another account says that Quinn went to the young lady's home and invited her to the gate as he went to leave, telling her he wanted to talk privately with her, and that as she went to return he shot at her, the ball entering in the left shoulder; and he, fearing the result of his deed, rushed home and ended his life.

The reports are meagre and conflicting, but it is more likely that the former account is the correct one. Enough is known, however, that Quinn is dead and that the young lady is not seriously hurt. Miss Thomas is one of the most charming young ladies in the county. She is 18 years of age and a recent graduate of the Cavanaugh College. Quinn is a married man, but five years ago domestic troubles caused his wife to leave him, and she returned to her father, Col. Irvine, of Copiah county.

Since the return of Miss Thomas from school Quinn has been paying her devoted attentions and they were engaged to be married as soon as he could obtain a divorce, which would have been at the January term of court. The parents of both parties were terribly opposed to the match. Quinn fearing that opposition would result disastrously to him before the divorce could be obtained, was persistent in his appeals to the young lady to elope with him—when she refused to do. At her refusal he supposed he became blinded with desperation and attempted to force her, when brought on a quarrel ending in such a sad and tragic way.

The families of both parties are among the best known people in the county, in good circumstances and highly respected. The Thomases and Quinns lived near neighbors and were the best of friends, and now a madman commits a deed that will weigh their hearts with sorrow. If Murray Quinn is the young man's father and is justice of the peace it that precinct.
