THE MACE-ALLEN FIGHT.

TEN ROUNDS FOUGHT.

First Blood for Mace—First Knock-Down for Allen.

ALLEN VANQUISHED IN FORTY-FIVE MINUTES.

He Is Badly Punished—Mace Unscratched.

FULL PARTICULARS.

[Special despatch to the Cairo Bulletin.]

The great fist fight between Thomas Allen and John Mace took place at Oakland plantation, near New Orleans, this morning at 9 o'clock. Over two thousand spectators, including a number of females, were present.

The crowd arrived on the ground shortly after eight o'clock. Some time was devoted to the arrangement of preliminaries. Objections were urged to the length of Allen's spikes, but the friends of Allen, not feeling disposed to resist the objection, the spikes were filed down. At precisely nine o'clock the men entered the ring, and shook hands cordially. The seconds then took their places and the fight commenced.

The crowd arrived on the ground shortly after eight o'clock. Some time was devoted to the arrangement of preliminaries. Objections were urged to the length of Allen's spikes, but the friends of Allen, not feeling disposed to resist the objection, the spikes were filed down. At precisely nine o'clock the men entered the ring, and shook hands cordially. The seconds then took their places and the fight commenced.

The crowd arrived on the ground shortly after eight o'clock. Some time was devoted to the arrangement of preliminaries.
