THE WAR. ANTICIPATED SURRENDER OF PARIS.

FIGHTING AT BEAUME.

Glomy Prospect for France. Victory Claimed by Both Parties.

Who Blame the Controversy.

Letter by balloons from Paris, private letters from Versailles, and dispatches from Berlin, all concur in representing the prospects of the French as extremely gloomy.

The Germans in the late engagements with the army of the Loire, lost enormously, still their position has been maintained. The efforts of General D'Aurelle to advance to the relief of Paris have been followed. Provisions in Paris are almost exhausted—scarcely a fortnight's supply remains.

REPORTED FRENCH VICTORY AT BEAUME.

A special correspondent at Versailles, on the 26th, writes: Yesterday urgent orders were telegraphed to all army food contractors to be prepared in anticipation of an early surrender of Paris to furnish extraordinary supplies.

REPORTED FRENCH VICTORY AT BEAUME.

A special from Tours dated 26th ult. says: Yesterday the right wing of the Army of the Loire, having repulsed during the previous day several attempts of the enemy to turn its flank, advanced to Gien, and Montargis and then commenced a movement toward Pithiviers in combination with an advance of the right center of the army at Artenay to the same point. While these movements were being made detachments of the enemy were in every case driven toward Beaume, midway between Montargis and Pithiviers. There at 2 p.m. the enemy massed 40,000 men consisting of the Tenth Corps. The English also give news of the French having captured the Prussian positions from the south, capturing two guns. At nightfall the Germans seemed to be retreating further north. The German losses on the 27th were very heavy. THE OTHER SIDE OF THE STORY—VICTORY CLAIMED BY THE PRUSSIAN.

VERSAILLES, Nov. 29.—The French yesterday, attacked the German forces at Beaume, between Montargis and Pithiviers, and were repulsed. Prince Frederic Charles directed the operations. One thousand prisoners fell into our hands.

THE FEELING IN ENGLAND.

LONDON, Nov. 29.—The Times says: Desiring peace on the maintenance of peace guarantees and repudiation altogether of the claim to supersede obligation of the treaty of 1856, a violation of which we cannot acquiesce in. The Times also gives news of the question of Russia's claims. Also, a note from Count Bernstorff to Granville stating that Prussia recommended Russia to withdraw Gortschakoff's note on condition that the conference be held. Gortschakoff's second note was read a third time.

THE FEELING IN ST. PETERSBURG.

Private advices from St. Petersburg represent that the anti-English feeling is so strong that even old English residents consider it necessary to absent themselves from public places.

VIENNA, Nov. 29.—It is reported here that recent denunciations from St. Petersburg demand that preparations be made by the European powers for early action.

LONDON, Nov. 29.—The New York Tribune correspondent at Vienna telegraphs this afternoon that the proposal to Prussia for a conference on the Black Sea question has been submitted to the Austrian Cabinet and accepted in principle, but a final agreement is made, dependent on certain preliminaries.

PRUSSIA OPINION OF ENGLANDS ATTITUDE.

New York Nov. 29.—The World's correspondent at Versailles, 25th, says: "The opinion at headquarters is that England means nothing by speaking for Turkey but will back down soon as, soon as she sees Russia and Prussia acting together."
