AN ORDINANCE

To amend section 246 of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance to adopt the ordinances of the city of Cairo, as revised and codified."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the city of Cairo:

Section 1. That section numbered 246 of an ordinance to adopt the ordinances of the city of Cairo, as revised and codified, be amended by adding at the end of the section the following words, viz: "President, That no Dog or Slut shall, between the 1st day of June and the 1st day of November run at large within the limits of said city without having a substantial wire of leather, or other material securely fastened over and around its mouth, so as, under all circumstances, to effectually prevent its biting."
