The weather is more mixed than ever, as in addition to sunshine and clouds we have rain and snow. If such an extensive assortment does not suit everybody, we must say they are hard to please, and would grumble if they were going to be hanged.

The river has fallen eight inches since last report. Business continues fair. The Mississippi is about stationary at St. Louis, with five and a half feet in the channel to that port.

The Ohio is falling at Pittsburg with ten feet in the channel. It is falling at Louisville with seven and a half feet down the Indiana chute over the falls and six feet over the rocks.

The Cumberland is falling with six feet on Harpeth Shoals. The Evansville Packets continue to bring out fair trips for reshipment to various points.

The Paducah Packet is now doing a paying business, in both freight and people. Her way business is the most profitable.

The Kate Kearney is unloading here on the Miss. Val. Co's barges, and will return to St. Louis.

The Kate Robinson, recently sunk at Neely's and raised last Saturday, is expected here to-day en route to Mount City to go on the ways for repairs.

The Tyrone brought 35 head cattle for Memphis, 175 empty flour barrels for C. Galligher, Cairo, and about 50 tons sundries for reshipment to St. Louis and Southern ports.

The Leonora No. 2 has been raised and goes to Cincinnati for repairs. Capt. Dugan is at work with his new wrecking boat, Thos. F. Eckert, trying to save the freight of the sunken steamer Swallow.

The Olive Branch is nearly loaded and leaves here this evening for N. O. The Thompson Dean is due for the same port.

The Sam Orr is the regular Cairo and Evansville Packet this evening. The Tyrone, Capt. Tom Harmon, is the regular packet for Nashville this evening.

All boats of the Cairo and Nashville Line give through receipts for freight from Cairo to points reached by the Nashville and Chattanooga Railroad.

The White leaves as usual for Paducah this evening. Capt. Charles T. Hinde is agent for the above boats.
