The weather was very cold yesterday and last night, being from 2 to 12 degrees below freezing point, but it moderated greatly this morning and the thermometer at noon indicated 48 deg.,—10 degrees above the freezing point. The skies were cloudless, and a warm south wind was blowing with a spring like influence which will soon, if it continues, clear the Mississippi of ice.

The river has fallen ten inches since last report. Ice ceased running out of the Mississippi for several hours Sunday morning on account of a gorge 25 miles above Cairo, but the W. R. Arthur broke through the gorge and the ice has been flowing steadily ever since.

The Mississippi is falling slowly at St. Louis, and full of ice. Only five feet six inches water is reported to that city.

The Ohio is falling at Pittsburg with seven feet in the channel. It is stationary at Louisville with ten feet in the canal and seven feet down the Indiana chute over the falls, but will be rising to-day.

The Cumberland is rising with nine feet on Harpeth Shoals.

Business here continues good at the wharf.

The Great Republic had about 70 tons for Chicago St. Louis and Cumberland river, which she reshipped here and is now loading for a return trip to N. O.

The Thompson Dean left for N. O. Saturday night after receiving here 1600 tons.

The Armadillo reshipped 30 tons ordnance stores here for St. Louis, to be forwarded per rail.

The Evansville Nashville Paducah and Columbus Packets continue to bring good trips for reshipment from this city.

The A. Baker brought out a fair cargo for reshipment to Nashville, St. Louis and other points.

The Talisman, Capt. Wm. Strong, is the regular Cairo and Cumberland River packet to day.

The Wm. White is the regular Cairo and Paducah packet this evening.

The Kenton leaves for Cincinnati to-day.

Capt. Chas. T. Hindle is agent for all the above boats.
