





As many persons were standing on the tracks of the Tacoma & Eastern at Kapowsin, Wash., a runaway train loaded with logs crashed into them, instantly killing A. B. Voorhees of Tacoma, formerly of Detroit, Mich., and fatally injuring John Bullen. Mrs. C. F. Forner was so seriously injured that she died within half an hour.

Dr. T. J. Buchanan of Eastman, Ga., was shot and instantly killed by his son. The father had threatened to kill his wife and children.

In a quarrel with one of his stable hands at the Harlem race track in Chicago, Sidney S. Bender was struck with a pitchfork and so badly injured that he may die. His assailant, known as "Dutch,' 'was arrested.

The preliminary hearing of C. Ellsworth Upton and Thomas W. Mc-Gregor, charged with complicity in the postoffice department frauds, took place at Baltimore. They were held to the grand jury.
