By a statute that was passed some time ago, any person who at the time of application holds more than 160 acres of land is disqualified from making entry on government land in any form. The question as to whether the certificate for school land is included in this was the point that had to be decided. The officials here decided that the person who under such circumstances made application was barred from making further entry. The point is one that never came up in the office here before and quite likely was never brought up in any
