Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Minot, North Dakota. That it is deemed necessary and to the best interests of the citizens, residents, freeholders and inhabitants of the City of Minot, and especially for those inhabitants and residents who reside along and in the vicinity of, and will be especially benefitted thereby, and is hereby declared to be necessary, that sewer No. 1, of Sewer District No. 2 be built, and that man-holes, catch-basins, and out-fall be installed in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by the City Engineer of the City of Minot, North Dakota, and approved and ordered filed with the City Auditor on the 12th day of April, A. D. 1909, and now on file with the city auditor, and which plans and specifications particularly specify the streets and avenues where the sewers will be laid mainly. On Second street from Third avenue to Sixth avenue. On Fourth avenue from Fourth street to Second street. On Fifth avenue from Fourth street to Second street. On Sixth avenue from Second street North to the Mouse River; that said plans and specifications particularly show the location of all man-holes catch-basins and out-fall, together with an estimate of the cost thereof, and which plans and specifications are herein referred to and made a part hereof.

Be it Further Resolved: That the said construction of sewers herein mentioned shall be paid for by special assessment upon the property especially benefitted thereby according to law, and pursuant to article 18 of chapter 30 of the Political Code of North Dakota for 1905, together with acts amendatory thereto.


