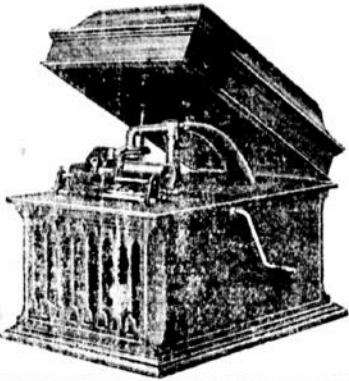

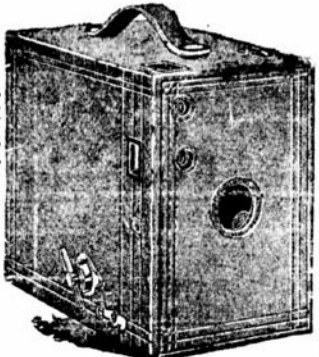

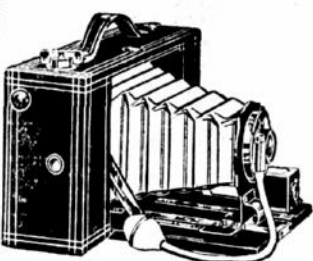

NOTICE FOR BIDS.

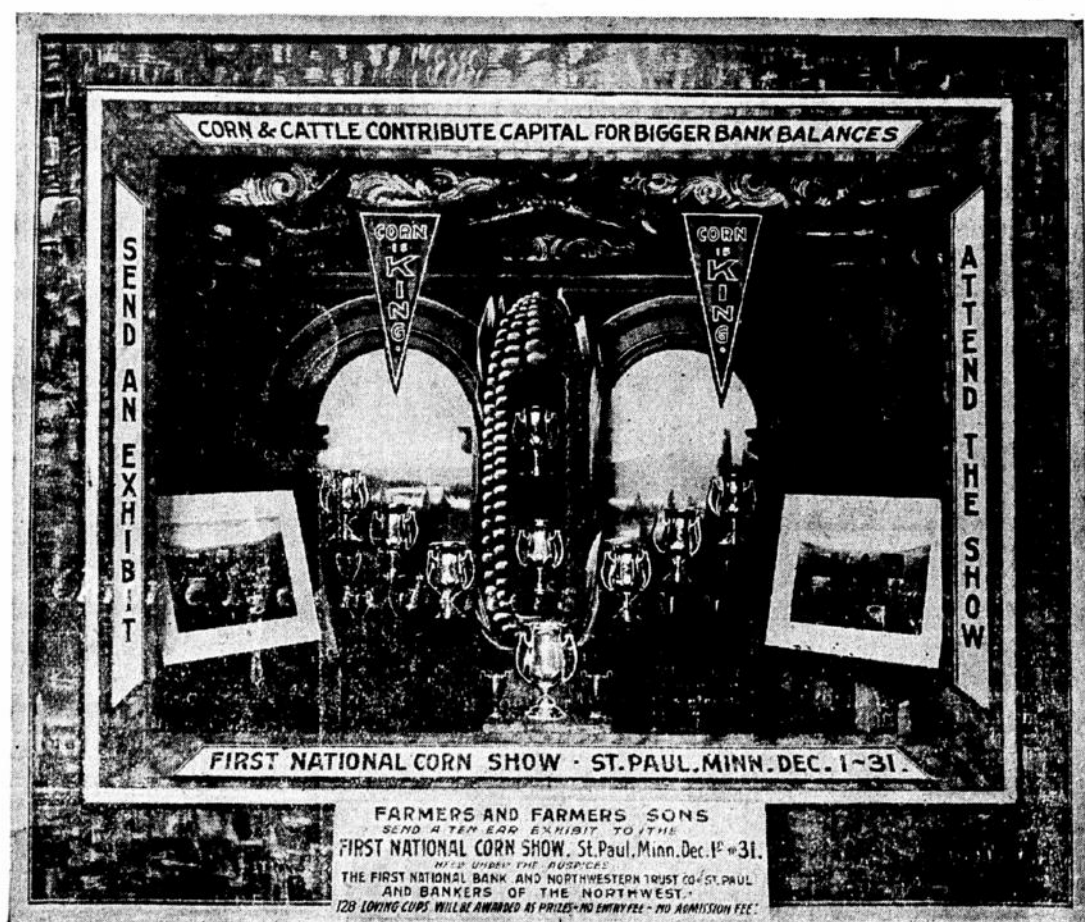

FIRST NATIONAL CORN SHOW

ST. PAUL, DECEMBER 1-31, 1915



The First National Corn Show to be held at St. Paul, December 1st, to 31st, 1915, under the auspices of the First National Bank and Northwestern Trust Co. of St. Paul and Bankers of the Northwest, will be the largest exclusive corn show ever held in that territory, it being an open competition for the states of Minnesota, North and South Dakota, Montana, Washington, Oregon and Idaho. While competition at the show will be limited to entries from the states mentioned, interest in the project will be nation-wide. The promoters, realizing the exceptional opportunity of directing the attention of corn growers throughout the United States to the splendid resources of the Northwest for the production of corn, are putting forth every effort to make the

First National Corn Show a success. One hundred and twenty eight silver and goldyn bronze loving cups, valued at \$5000.00 are offered as prizes to exhibitors at the show. A feature of this project is the "Boys Corn Raising Competition", open to entry by boy corn growers, eighteen years of age or under. They will receive the same handsome cups as are offered the adult exhibitor. There will be no competition between the individual states, and each state has been divided into districts in such a manner, that farmers and farmer's sons may compete with associates who have no advantage over them in the way of better soil, climatic conditions, etc. In order to bring this show to the direct

attention of farmers and others interested in corn production throughout the Northwest, the promoters are sending out to various Northwestern fairs a road exhibit of the silver and goldyn bronze loving cups. The cups will be displayed in a booth of elaborate design and architectural construction. This departure from ordinary passive publicity methods is bound to bring forcibly to the attention of corn growers of the Northwest the desirability of entering this contest, not only for the intrinsic value of the cups offered and the honors that go to the winners, but to demonstrate to the entire United States the fact that corn can be, and is being, successfully produced in every county of the entire Northwest.
