ducted a economically as was possible under the circumstances. Thru the courtesy of the Fair Board, and a person of Minot and the acquiescence of United States officials the fair board has been accorded the use of two fine office rooms in the federal building in Minot. A considerable quantity of disused furniture belonging to the county was utilized in furnishing the offices and rooms at the fair grounds. The fine practical co-operation of the fair board relieved the fair board of the expense of providing a rest room for women and children. The coops of the former Minot Poultry association were loaned by John Stoudt, an officer of the association, and thus obviated the necessity of buying coops for the fair. The Cash Feed & Fuel Co. took charge of furnishing feed and hay to the live stock and acting as their own warehouse on the fairgrounds so the fair board was spared any ex-

If the fair grounds are to be made completely sightly the parkway in the main boulevard must be parked and planted with grass, trees and flowers. Some trees should also be set out along at least the side facing the Roosevelt Highway. The parts of the grounds used most generally around the buildings and along the midway
