They say that when the Great spirit made the earth, he also made three men, all of whom were fair complexioned; and that after making them, he led them to the margin of a small lake and bade them leap therein and wash. One immediately obeyed, and came from the water purer and fairer than before; the second hesitated a moment, during which time, the water agitated by the first, had become alightly maddied; and when he had bathed he came up copper-colored; the third did not leap in till the water became black with mud, and he eame out with its color. Then the Great Spirit laid before them three packages of bark and bade them choose, and out of pity for his misfortune in color, gave the black man his first choice. He took hold of each of the packages and having telt the weight, chose the heaviest; the coppersolored one then chose the second heaviest, leaving the white man the lightest. When the packages were opened, the first was found to contain spades, hoes, and all the implements of labor; the second eawrapped hunting, fishing and warlike apparatus; the third gave to the white man, pens, ink and paper—the engine of the mind—the means of mutual improvement—the secual link of humanity—the foundation of the white man's superiority.

Ato workers, some of our sister States, aggrieved like ours, are preparing measures for their future security, and for the safety of their institutions and their people, and both patriotism and the necessity of self-preservation require us to deliberate upon our own course of action.
