The state convention of Texas bankers in El Paso next week will attract a large number of prominent financiers from out of the state, as well as all the principal money handlers in Texas.

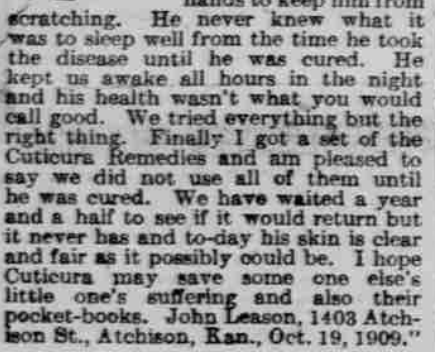

It is the intention of the Washington university corporation to make the school the superior of the Johns Hopkins university of Baltimore, now regarded as the leading medical college of the country.
