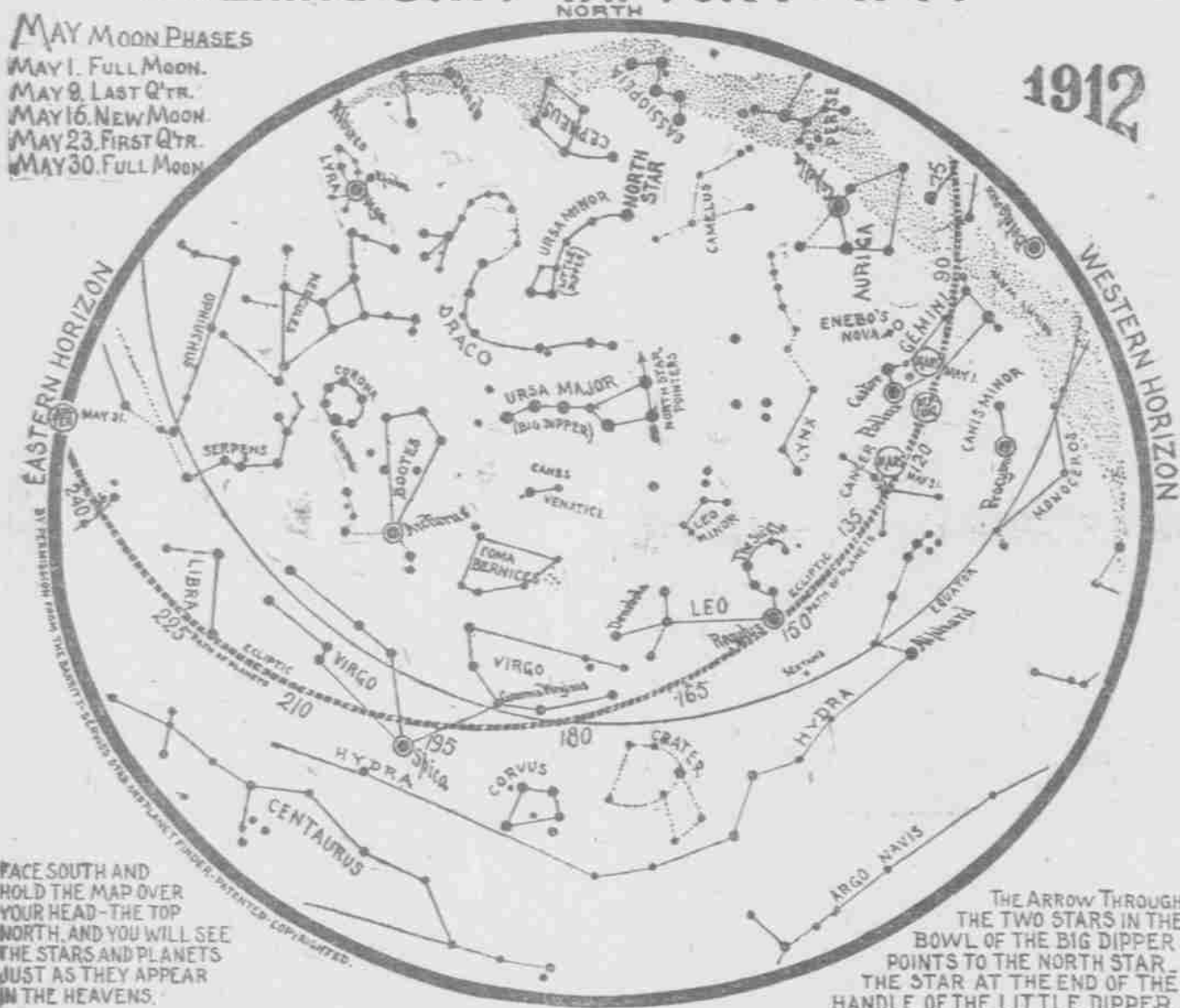

H E HEAR a considerable amount of serious discussion at the present time, when air ships, aeroplanes, and all manner of machines for navigating the air are becoming so common, about the possibility of flying

to the moon, or to Mars, or to some one of the other planets of the solar system. The writer would like, in the following space, to explain in a very brief and simple fashion a few of the scientific and actual impossibilities of our aviators ever attaining such a point as to be able to travel beyond the earth's atmosphere.

All of our readers know that at a point in the neighborhood of 100 miles or more above sea-level, the air of our world practically ceases, and that beyond this limit it would be utterly im-

possible for a man to survive without some other device constructed so as to supply him with the necessary amount of air to breathe. Everyone will grant, therefore, that were it within human power for an individual to exist beyond the limits of our atmosphere, he would certainly have to be provided with some means of storing and obtaining that most important ingredient to life, namely air. To begin with, let us imagine that we have an airship designed to convey provisions of food, water, and even air itself for

the traveler therein, capable of penetrating the earth's atmosphere and flying out into space. Before going one step further, we have to consider the fact that the air which is known to pervade every crack and crevice of the universe, viz., the "luminiferous ether," without encountering some extremely serious difficulties. We presuppose that our readers are informed that exterior to the air which encircles our globe is what is popularly called "space," although this so-called "space" is by no means a true vacuum as accepted in the theories of modern physical science. Any body which comes beyond the immediate gravitational control of our planet would ultimately come under the prevailing influence of the sun, and would, normally, forever after circulate round the latter in an independent orbit not unlike those of the various planets and periodic comets which occupy the interplanetary regions. On account of this well known physical law, the airship would be within its capacity to soar above the bounds of the life sustaining air which enshrouds our globe, would, with his conveyance, be compelled to move round the sun in a closed ellipse as a small satellite or wandering meteor, and would never be able to gain his destination or again return to mother earth. It is obvious, therefore, that this predicament is in itself quite sufficient to banish forever all our hopes of escaping from here--in this form at least.

However, let us just suppose it to be possible for a person to fly from here to the nearest of all the celestial bodies--the moon, for instance. The distance from the earth to the moon is approximately 238,900 miles; if a machine could be started from here so as to go to the moon, being provided beforehand, of course, with the very essential supplies of food and water, and a chamber containing that vitally important element, air, for the traveler to live on during his journey (for at a distance as short as eight or ten miles above the earth's surface the atmosphere is so rare that an ordinary individual can scarcely live there for any length of time, and out in space there is no air at all), and could be so devised as to travel at a uniform speed of 30 miles an hour, never stopping day or night, it would require over 200 days to make the trip. Think of it. Just picture mentally the vast amount of air alone that would have to be taken on such a voyage. In order, then, to carry with the very supplies necessary to actual life in the course of this time we should have to manufacture a machine of incredible size, and so arranged that the traveler could be supplied with pure, fresh air during every single moment of the journey, and what would he find upon reaching the moon? It is a well known fact in astronomy that the moon is what we might term a "dead world," for as far as modern investigation can indicate, no atmosphere is present on it. So it is to be strongly doubted whether an ordinary man could survive on our satellite after

Mercury will be visible as a morning star just before sunrise near the eastern horizon for a few days before and after May 12.

Venus is still a morning star, but is so near the sun this month that it probably will not be visible to the unaided eye.

Mars will be in the early evening sky. Its path eastward lies between Gemini and Cancer.

Jupiter rises in the east on the 1st, about 10 p. m., and on the 10th at sunset. It has an apparent retrograde motion westward of about four degrees during May. This apparent motion westward is caused by the earth's moving faster in its orbit than Jupiter, which is approaching opposition. It will be in opposition on June 1. At opposition the sun, earth and planet are in the same straight line. This apparent backward movement of the planet is not unlike the impression given a passenger on an express train when, although moving in the same direction, the express passes the local. It appears to move backward.

Saturn will pass from the evening to the morning sky this month and consequently will be too near the sun for observation.

Neptune is still in Gemini, setting about midnight.

Uranus rises in the east about midnight.

Pluto is still in Gemini, setting about midnight.
