

IRISH TERROR OFFICIAL SAYS BRITISH WRITER

(Continued from page 1.) In Europe which England and her allies have "freed." Not that he nor the prime minister, nor their supporters, can admit this because it gives away their moral case. They have in protest that this majority is against the result (the "Republican army," apparently) of intimidation at the hands of a small group of ruffians.

"Policy of reprisals" about which the people of England have just begun to hear, is carried out behind the scenes of the force of law and order in Ireland have suffered intolerable provocation. We must allow the police and soldiers to hit back, says the prime minister. It is already saying, says Mr. Churchill. It is bound to succeed, they both say. Now the average Englishman, who does not think politically, but merely makes a distinction between murder and acts of terrorism which are done deliberately and those which are done in cold blood.

"What has made his enemy about the movement's policy is that the reports which have begun to get into the English press point to the fact that many of these reprisals are deliberate. Warnings signed by military or police authorities are sent before-hand that in the event of attacks being made on the members of the Royal Irish Constabulary being shot in a village, or certain houses in it, will be burnt down. After liquoring up at the public house, these men proceed to destroy certain houses and buildings and shoot particular people against whom there is nothing but the supposition that they might have approved of the original outrages.

Endeavors Irish hatred. The young Irish who remember these things will continue to hate England, and excusable. I have spoken often of the effect of this policy on Englishmen who think morally. Those who think politically are shocked in another way as well. They feel that to suppress anarchy by anarchy is fatal to all government.

Soldiers are aware of this, and perhaps the side of our Irish policy which disturbs them most is that it leads inevitably to the demoralization of the army. What Englishmen cannot stomach are cases like those of Ballinacorney, when "executions" have taken place without any sort of trial, in addition to the destruction of property. Nor can he condone cases in which the behavior of the military shows that they were acting under orders and in cold blood.

How British Operate. An instance of the latter kind occurred at Tulla in county Clare, not many days ago. A party of military in charge of an officer visited the house of A. J. McCarthy and produced a document ordering them to burn her house. The same procedure was gone through at the house of Mr. Maloney. The first thing that is that in the 45 minutes allowed, the soldiers worked hard to help Mrs. McCarthy get the furniture out of her house. Now, this is clearly not a case of men giving way to impulses under provocation, but to use the words of the prime minister, "than human nature can tolerate." It is part of a deliberate campaign of arson and murder, which Englishmen are asked to excuse because Royal Irish Constabulary's and soldiers have been murdered.

The indication that it is a deliberate campaign of terrorism mentioned from above are. That orders either threatening reprisals or ordering them have not been regulated by the highest authorities. The systematic destruction of property, the loss of which will affect the greatest number of Irishmen. The fact that the prime minister and his colleagues defend them by accusing reprisals as necessary to self protection.

Soldiers and Black and Tans, the auxiliary force and the Royal Irish Constabulary, know that in the past, some of the 45 or so outrages, verdicts which have been brought against them have been followed up; that only punishment inflicted has been, in the case of the soldiers, a few days' stoppage of a few soldiers' leave, and that new corners' incidents have been suppressed.
