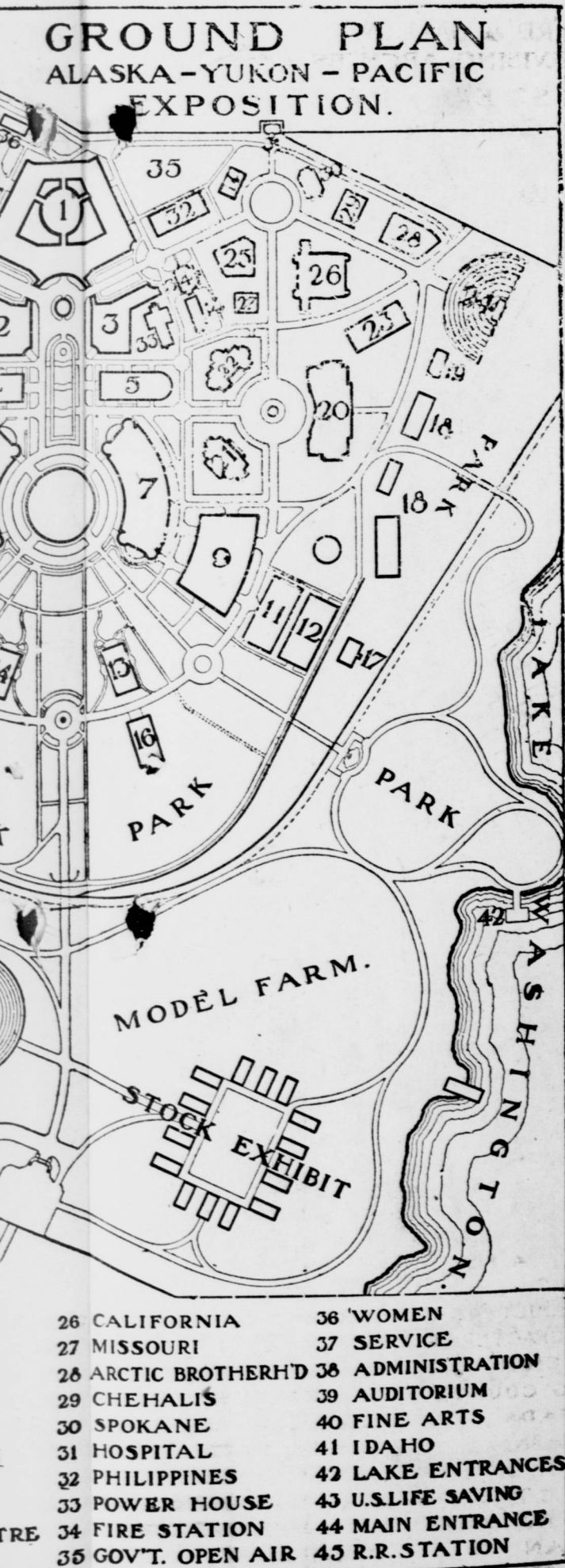
### Subscription Contracts
