

BIG STOCK SHOW AT PORTLAND IN SEPTEMBER.

Portland, August 16—Officials of the Lewis and Clark exposition are greatly pleased with the interest which is being taken in the stock show to be held at the exposition from September 19 to 29, and are confident that the large number of entries assures the success of the undertaking. In the neighborhood of \$50,000 is now available in prize money, the \$40,000 appropriated by the fair management having been augmented repeatedly by donations. It is not the prize money, however, but the excellence of the western market that is responsible for the interest which stockmen are taking in the show, according to M. D. Wisdom, live stock superintendent.

"The stock industry in the Pacific West has a wonderful future," says Mr. Wisdom, "and eastern breeders are just beginning to appreciate this fact. Several of the big firms are coming out with the intention of locating branch houses in the west if prospects seem favorable, and one of the largest firms, McLaughlin Brothers, of Columbus, Ohio, and Kansas City, Mo., already has established a branch office in Portland."

McLaughlin Brothers will show at the fair a fine lot of Clydesdales, Belgians, French Coach horses and Percheons, imported recently from Europe and never before exhibited. Alex. Galbraith, of Trent, Wash., likewise will exhibit for the first time an importation of Clydesdales, Suffolks and Percheons, and J. Grouch & Son of Lafayette, Ind., have entered forty head of Percheons, Belgians and German Coach horses.

W. S. Skinner, superintendent of the National Live Stock Show in Chicago, is getting together a trainload of Shorthorns, Herefords, Pole Angus and Galloway breeds for exhibition at the fair. The state of Missouri has appropriated \$50, for special premiums to be awarded the Missouri cattle making the best showing at the fair, and other influences combine to assure the success of this department of the show.

The showing of Shorthorns promises to be unusually good. The Oak Hill farm of North Yakima, leads off with an entry of 21 head, and other entries have been made by W. O. Miner, of Heppner, Ore.; Jay P. Graves and H. W. Peel of Spokane, and Charles E. Ladd, of Portland, whose herd won first prize at the St. Louis fair last year. E. D. Mitchell of Clinton, Mo., owner of the famous Tebo herd, with Choice Good at its head, also has applied for stall room, and there are many other entries.

W. H. Ladd, of Portland, whose Loretta D. won first prize in the dairy class at St. Louis, will be among the exhibitors of dairy breeds. Several other Oregon stockmen have entered Jerseys. Charles E. Pierce, of Stockton, Cal., who owns by far the finest herd of Holsteins in the world, will show forty head which he has imported direct from Holland. Mrs. William D. Honeyman will exhibit her Kelbin Grove herd of Ayershires, which is one of the finest in America.
