NEWS OF WESTON FREEWATER ADVICES

MANY PEOPLE INTERESTED IN WESTON'S MARKET DAY.

Briggson School is Closed for Present Term—Big District Conference Will Take Place in Weston—Normal Boys Are Putting Grounds in Fine Shape — Independent Telephone Line to Run From Weston.

Weston, March 21.—Weston is a very busy place today. The attraction is Weston's first market day, and many of the farmers from the surrounding country here. Wesley Carter is the auctioneer, and it is expected that much farm produce will be disposed of.

Mrs. H. B. Nelson, formerly of this place, who has been quite ill in the Walla Walla hospital for some weeks, is reported to be doing nicely at this time, and she will be able to leave the hospital shortly.

The school has closed in the Briggson district for the present term. The sophomores of the normal will give an emerald green entertainment at the normal assembly hall this evening.

Conference at Weston.

The district conference of the Walla Walla district, East Columbia conference of the M. E. church south, will be held in the Weston M. E. church, March 26, 27, 28 and 29. There will be present about 10 preachers and two lay delegates from each charge. Programs will be carried out each day.

Athletic Grounds.

The normal school athletic grounds are being put in shape for the spring season. A track meet will take place at Weston at an early date with Pearson's academy of Walla Walla. The baseball team will go to Prescott April 11, and they will play Pearson's on the home ground on April 18.

Independent Telephone Line. Different parties interested are now working on a plan for an independent telephone line over 20 miles long to run from the long distance station at Weston east to the Blue mountain saw mill, thence to Bingham Springs, from which there will be branches east and west, connecting with the government forest ranger's camp at the forks of the Umatilla, and W. J. Furnish's summer residence.

FRUIT GROWERS WILL BUILD WAREHOUSE SOON

Market Days Postponed for Short Time—Presented With Silver Headed Walking Stick By Freewater Lodge—Will Go to Hermiston to Engage in Farming—Hay Shipments Made to Seattle and Other Points.

Freewater, Mar. 21.—The next market day for Freewater will be held April 4. On account of the busy season and the bridges being washed out north of Walla Walla, it was decided to postpone the sale until that time instead of holding it March 25 as was intended.

Wednesday evening at the Odd Fellows hall the members of Freewater lodge No. 202 presented C. A. Bacon of Boston, Mass., with a silver headed walking stick. He has been here for the past three months and has taken a great interest in the lodge.

To Build Big Warehouse.

The Milton Fruit Growers Union will continue business under the present name and organization. It has been decided to erect a warehouse 40x150, one and a half stories high, with an 8-foot basement. It will be constructed of concrete, practically fire proof. Stock for the building will be solicited at once, and the entire Milton and Freewater country will be interested in the success of the venture.

Principal Pennock is arranging to leave for Hermiston, where he has a homestead. He will give up teaching to devote his time to farm work.

Several shipments of hay have been made to Seattle during the past few days. Most of it came in from the Hudson Bay country.
