In injunction proceedings against organized steam engineers of Zanesville, Ohio, Common Pleas Judge Lebert said the rights of an individual were not lessened when he associated with others in the joint exercise of their individual rights.

"The right of either capitalists or workers to choose with whom they will deal and to give their patronage and custom to those with whom they can make favorable contracts, is as clear as the right of an individual to do so," said the court. "If the object sought to be attained is lawful, a labor union has a right, by fair persuasion and argument, to seek the support and moral influence of those upon whom they bestow their favors as an aid in accomplishing the object sought."

"A person with or without reason may refuse to trade with another; so may 10 or 50 persons refuse." In granting a restraining order, a Chicago judge had an entirely different version of this economic question.

STATE POLICE BILL.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., May 10.—The State Senate has rejected a state police bill by a narrow margin of two votes. Organized labor waged a continuous war against this measure, which was also urged in the previous session of the State Legislature. Advocates of the bill affected a deep concern for farmers, but trade unionists showed why large industrial interests favor the Cossacks.
