SILENCE AND DEATH.

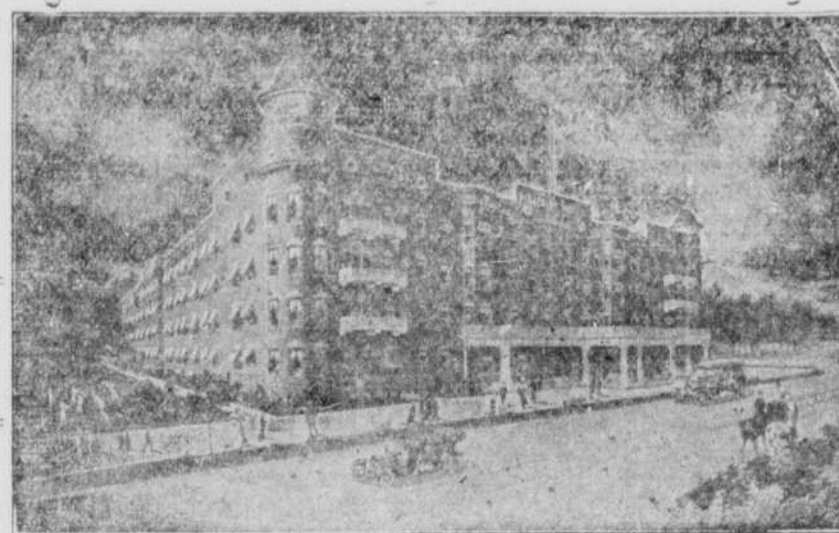
