GERMAN OFFICERS TO BE CARRIED ON HOSPITAL SHIPS.

London, March 28, 3:35 a. m.—It is assumed by the press that the sinking of the hospital ship Asturias will be met with prompt reprisals in accordance with the declaration issued by the British foreign office at the end of January, when the German threat to sink hospital ships was made on the allegation that such vessels were being used as transports.

The form that the reprisals may take has not been indicated officially, but the suggestion was then made that several of the highest ranking German officers among the British prisoners should be carried on all hospital ships.

ILLINOIS LEGISLATURE KILLS DRY LEGISLATION.

Springfield, Ill., March 28.—The Illinois house of representatives today killed all pending dry legislation, including the statewide prohibition referendum bill.

The latter measure, on which the drys had centered their campaign, went down to defeat, 80 to 67, after three hours' impassioned oratory.
