### A MILLION OF PENSIONERS.

A million pensioners and the civil war closed over a third of a century ago. A million pensioners and not a million men enlisted in the Union armies. Since the close of that struggle persons who were unborn at the time have succeeded their fathers. The generation which fought the war has passed away, and yet a million are left.

Minister Wu's Absence From the State Department Causes Speculation.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3.—The absence of the Chinese minister from the state department yesterday, in spite of the fact that it was diplomatic day, taken in connection with the exceedingly sharp note of Secretary Hay, which the state department has made public, was the subject of speculation. Minister Wu explained his absence on the ground that ne had no news to communicate, and his appearance at the department this morning was awaited with considerable interest. The minister came in the course of the mouning, impertuble as he announced that he had absolutely no news from China and he came to the department simply to see if Secretary

Hay was any better off.

#### OFFICIALS ARE INDIGNANT. News From China Indicates Serious

Resistance to the Advance. WASHINGTON, Aug. 3.—The state department makes public the following telegram received today, dated Aug. 3, from Consul General Goodnow, at Shanghai, and the consul at Che Foo:

"The Americans left Chunking yes terday. Li Hung Chang told the French consul today that no messages would be delivered to the ministers because the foreigners were advancing on Peking. Two pro-foreign members of the tsung li yamen were beheaded July 27 for urg-ing the preservation of the ministers, by Li Ping Han, now commanding the troops at Peking. He ordered the Pao

The following has been received from Consul Fowler at Che Foo, dated Aug. 2: "Have just received a telegram from the governor of Shan Tung requesting me to transmit to you the following:

"'Have just received telegram dated July 30 from the tsung li yamen stating various ministers, the German legation and others (foreigners) all well; not in Provisions were repeatedly sent. Relations most friendly. Now conferring as to measures to protect va-rious ministers to Tien Tsin for tempo-rary shelter, which conference will soon be ended."


