**Local Farm Loan Association Flourishes**

The Nezperce National Farm Loan Association held its annual meeting at Nezperce on Monday, Feb. 3rd. The reports of the officers show that the organization is in a flourishing condition. It has actually closed loans in this vicinity amounting to \$100,500.00, with \$15,000.00 more approved and awaiting the convenience of the borrowers. The local association does business on a margin of one fourth of one percent to the borrowers and is said to be operating on the least percentage cost of any association in the northwest. It is entirely out of debt and has not a single member that is delinquent in the payment of his interest.

At the annual meeting the following directors were elected for the ensuing year: Norton B. Miller, Lee J. Rowe, Geo. I. Lynn, Nicholas H. Jacobs, Wm. Sullivan, J. H. Mitchell and Thos. F. Jacobs. Nicholas H. Jacobs was elected president, Wm. Sullivan, vice-president, and C. H. Nugent, secretary-treasurer.

The following loan committee was elected: Wm. Sullivan, Lee J. Rowe and Norton B. Miller, with Geo. I. Lynn, Thos. F. Jacobs and J. H. Mitchell as alternates.

It was decided at the meeting to take a more active part in bringing the advantages of these loans before the farmers. The advantages of an amortization loan may not generally be known outside of the members. These loans are made at 5 1/2 per cent interest and the borrower each year pays one per cent on the principal. The payment of this 6 1/2 per cent for a period of about thirty eight years pays off the loan both as to principal and interest. If the farmer borrows \$5000.00 private money at 6 1/2 per cent interest he may pay interest for thirty eight years and still owe the \$5000.00. If he borrows from the Government the 6 1/2 per cent for that time pays out principal, interest and all.

The federal Land Bank is organized on the co-operative plan where the borrower instead of the lender gets the advantage of the earnings and compounding of his own money.

The man who retains his loan for the full period until it pays

itself off on the 6 1/2 per cent per annum payment is getting as good as a 4 1/4 per cent private loan.

Farming is the only business today that can be financed for fifty per cent of its value on 4 1/4 per cent money on thirty eight years' time. It used to be that the farmers were compelled to pay the highest rates of interest of any class of borrowers, but by taking advantage of the Federal Loan they may now finance themselves on a lesser rate of interest than big business is required to pay. This being exclusively a farming section, the members of the association invite all interested farmers to investigate for themselves.

**NOTICE OF ELECTION**

For Creation of North Highway District of Lewis County, Idaho.

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th day of February, A. D., 1919, between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon, on said day, a special election will be held by the qualified electors residing on the lands contained within the boundaries herein below set forth, and for the purpose of this election, the lands within the boundaries of the proposed district shall constitute one election precinct.

The polling place of said election is hereby designated to be at that certain school building located within said district in the county of Lewis, State of Idaho, known as the Sunset school house in school district No. 28 of said county and state.

The qualifications of an elector to vote at said election shall be the same as that of a voter at any general election held in the state of Idaho, with the additional provision that the elector must be a resident the boundaries of the proposed highway district and no previous registration shall be necessary.

Said election is to be held for the purpose of determining whether or not a highway district shall be created under the provisions of chapter 55, Session Laws of 1911 of the state of Idaho, and the amendments thereto and thereof, to be known as the North Highway District of Lewis County, Idaho.

The lands to be included within such proposed district are set out in the petition and by map on file in the office of the clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of the county of Lewis, state of Idaho, to which reference is hereby made, and said lands proposed to be included are enclosed within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

"Beginning at the mouth of the Meek Canyon, where the Meek Canyon Creek empties into the Big Canyon Creek; thence running in a southeasterly direction up said Meek Canyon Creek to the north line of section 15, township 34 north, range one west of the Boise Meridian; thence east to the middle of the north line of section 14, township 34 north, range one west of the Boise Meridian; thence south one and one-half miles; thence east three miles; thence south one mile; thence east three miles; thence north to the Little Canyon Creek; thence down the Little Canyon Creek to the point where the same flows into the Big Canyon Creek; thence up the Big Canyon Creek to the point of beginning."
