Feed Sugar Beet Pulp.

It may not be generally known in Utah that enormous herds of sheep from this state and Idaho are fattened for the markets of Chicago and other eastern cities in Colorado, but such is the case according to L. H. Sweetser of American Falls, who is one of the most extensive sheep and cattle men of the intermountain region. Mr. Sweetser says:

"Feeding sheep and lambs in the Fort Collins, Colorado, district proved to be very interesting to me, but the feature of greatest interest was the fact that such enormous quantities of lambs came from Utah and Idaho.

"The feed used is the pulp from sugar beets. It makes splendid feed and when mixed with just a small quantity of grain is excellent. The sheep from this state and Idaho, of course, never come back here but go directly from Fort Collins towns to the eastern markets.

"There are now six factories in the district and the erection of another is contemplated, which will be the largest in the country. The industry of feeding sheep and cattle on pulp will soon prove to be a very large one.

"Utah and Idaho sheep bring the highest prices of any sheep raised in the entire west and are always in demand."
