Development of Port St. Lucie

Capt. J. H. Rogers, of Sewalls Point, who is prominently associated with the Sewalls Point Land Company and the building of Port St. Lucie, was in the city the first of the week and reported many improvements in progress and in

immediate prospect in the new city. The main avenue, 100 feet wile and 21 miles long, has been cleared and practically graded. Piling for a pier 170 feet in length with a 60 foot T at the end has been put down. Captain Sewall and Captain Rogers have recently completed a canal and basin at the end of Sewalls Point, making a splendid harbor. Dredging operations are in progress opening a 40-foot canal connecting the inland lakes at Port St. Lucie with St. Lucie River.

Captain Rogers also stated that modern electric light, ice and water plants will be erected by November, and a hotel will also be built this summer. He is confident that an appropriation will be made at the next session of congress for the inlet at Gilberts Baran improvement that means much to Palm Beach County. In this connection he stated that the government had called for bids for opening a waterway from Great Pocket to Peck's Lake. This improvement will greatly simplify inside navigation from West Palm Beach to Sewalls Point. - Palm Beach County.
