CORPORAL BARKLEY DID NOT QUIT WHEN HE HAD DONE HIS FULL DUTY.

There is a regular soldier still in France who is going to get the Congressional Medal of Honor. To him was given the supreme honor of breaking up a German attack all by himself, an attack, if it had been successful, would have decided the lertunes of the battle in favor of the
