

THIRD DEFEAT AT HANDS OF MONTEVIDEO

Willmar Again Suffers Defeat in Game Sunday. Score 12 to 4

The Montevideo nine made it three straight from Willmar by defeating the local team at the ball park here last Sunday afternoon. The score was 12 to 4.

The big inning for Montevideo was the fourth when the winners scored five runs by five hits and one error. The result of this inning alone was sufficient for the visitors to win the game. Watts started the big rally by smacking a two-run homer to left field. Askeroth was taken out and Christenson went in to pitch. Dean landed on the next one for three bases to the right garden. OLD BONUS CLAIMS TO BE HEARD SOON

Ex-Service Men are Advised To Register for Coming Bonus Board Meeting

Disputed and unpaid bonus claims of all ex-soldiers in this district, will be aired at a special meeting of the Bonus Board of Review, in Willmar, August 10th.

Former service men who wish to have their bonus difficulties settled, and which makes it necessary to appear before the Board, should send their names at once or not later than August 5th to Henry G. Young at Willmar. It is important that the claimant send his name in order to be listed for the meeting. All files and back records of claims to be heard by the Board of Review will be brought to Willmar.

This is the last time any state bonus claims will be heard for settlement in Willmar. It is therefore advisable for any who have not received their money to take advantage of the state offer to straighten out their claims.

The Bonus Board of Review was appointed by Governor Prens to hear the claims of the former service men. So far, many entangling cases have been cleared satisfactorily.
