

Keep the little chicks where they can get in the warm sunshine these cold days and they will grow and thrive better than in the summer, when it is so hot. Keep them out of the cold rains. Feed plenty of good feeds after they are a few days old. Never feed them anything the first day. I feed commercial chick feed, but corn bread, damp mash, etc. is good. Give them plenty of green feed, also some kind of grit. Grease their heads and necks with lard or sweet oil to kill the head lice.—Progressive Farmer.
