Provides that all persons selling gasoline, kerosene or other products used for the propelling of motor vehicles shall collect, in addition to the regular charge therefor, the sum of one cent per gallon for each gallon so sold. Such tax shall be monthly reports to the county clerk of the county in which he shall be located, showing the amount of gasoline sold and the tax, and shall pay into the treasury of the county that amount. The county treasurer shall make a report quarterly to the county court showing the amount of money so received under the provisions of this Act, and if the court finds said statement correct, it shall direct the county treasurer to credit one-half of said amount to the general road fund and the other half shall be paid to the State Treasurer for the credit of the Highway Improvement Fund. Provides for the violation of any of the provisions of this Act of a fine of not less than a nor more than one thousand dollars. ACT NO. 589. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to regulate the selling or offering of said agricultural seeds and providing for inspection of analysis, etc. Provides that every lot of agricultural seed when in bulk, packages or containers of ten pounds or more shall have fixed thereto a printed tag or label showing the common name of such seed, name of the State where the seed was grown, the approximate percentage by weight of purity, approximate weight of seed, and name of every kind of weed or blight, the approximate percentage of the germination of such agricultural seeds, together with the full name and address of the vendor of such seeds. Provides for the inspection, sampling and testing of such seeds. ACT NO. 615. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to amend Section 2333 of Crawford & Moses Digest. Amends said section so as to make the same apply to Columbia, Hempstead and Hot Spring counties. ACT NO. 632. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to provide for the formation and carrying on of co-operative associations. Provides that any number of persons, not less than twenty may associate themselves together as a co-operative association for the purpose of conducting any agricultural, dairy, merchantile, mining, manufacturing or mechanical business on a co-operative plan. Provides for written articles of incorporation, which shall be filed with the Secretary of State. Provides that said corporations shall make an annual report to the Commissioner of Mines, Manufacture and Agriculture. ACT NO. 634. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to amend Section 1919 of Crawford & Moses Digest. Amends said section, which prohibits inmates of the Confederate Home from drawing a pension, to provide that such inmates shall be given an allowance of an amount not to exceed \$5.00 per month. ACT NO. 641. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to amend Section 9141 of Crawford & Moses Digest. Provides that person claiming to own lands known as Sixteenth Section or School Land or any land sold under mortgage given secure school funds whose claim is based on an unbroken chain of title dating back to 1889, who has been in actual possession of said land for twenty years, that all the title which the State of Arkansas may appear to have in said lands is hereby vested in said person, and the Commissioner of State Lands is hereby ordered and directed upon such proof to make deed therefor. ACT NO. 644. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to amend Section 4 of Act No. 414 of the General Assembly of 1917. Amends Section 4 of said Act (an Act creating the State Plant Board) to provide that the Chief Engineer of the said Board shall receive a salary not to exceed \$3,500.00 per year. ACT NO. 671. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to quiet title to lands in certain cases. Provides that persons who have been in possession of paid taxes on land which was sold to the State of Arkansas under a court for overdue taxes, for a period of twenty years, the State relinquishes its title to said lands in such cases, and the Commissioner of State Lands is hereby ordered and directed upon such proof to make deed therefor. ACT NO. 676. Approved March 26, 1921. An Act to appropriate money for the construction and equipment of build-

ings at the University of Arkansas. Appropriates the sum of \$350,000.00 for the purpose of erecting and equipping buildings for the University of Arkansas. ACT NO. 689. An Act to make appropriation for the Department of State Lands, Highways and Improvements. Appropriates the sum of \$208,898.01 for maintenance of the Department of State Lands, Highway and Improvements, and appropriates the sum of \$500,000.00 for State Aid in the construction and maintenance of rural post roads, for the biennial period ending June 30, 1923. Appropriations to be paid out of the Highway Improvement Fund. This Act became a law March 30, 1921, without the approval of the Governor. ACT NO. 690. An Act to empower visiting committees appointed by the Senate and the House to invite the Bureau of Education of the Department of Interior of the United States to make a survey and investigation of the University of Arkansas. Authorizes said committees to invite the Bureau of Education of the Department of Interior of the United States to make a survey of the University of Arkansas to determine its efficiency and economy and to make a report of its findings, with such recommendations as they see fit, before September 1, 1921. Provides that said Board of Education, or its duly authorized representatives, shall have access to all records, books, documents, etc., of the University. Appropriates the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of such investigation. Provides that the committees above referred to who shall assist in such investigation shall receive the sum of \$5.00 per day and their actual traveling expenses while engaged in such work. Requires that a full and complete report shall be filed showing the results of the investigation. Provides that any person who shall fail or refuse to furnish any information demanded of him shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty days nor more than six months.
