CITY BUSINESS

Paonia, Colorado, June 21, 1910
The Board of Trustees of the Town of Paonia, Colorado, met in regular session on the above date and was called to order by the mayor. On roll call the following responded: Mayor Nelson, Trustees: Hawkins, Hufty, Bryant, Baker and Castell.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Petitions of the property owners on Main Ave. north of 3d St. asking for a four inch water main was read and referred to the water committee.

Petition of J. F. Wakefield for a renewal of his license on the pool room was read and on motion duly seconded was granted.

The water committee reported they had Mr. Shallenberger go over the specifications with them and they find them approximately correct. On motion duly seconded the clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for excavating, for furnishing the cement, sand and gravel, according to specifications, delivered on the ground. Will consider bids on any one or all, all to be under the direction of a superintendent, to be employed by the town, he to be under the direction of the water committee. The town reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Putting in the material to be done by days work.

The water committee recommended that the town lease the Wannemaker reservoir for one year at a rental of one hundred dollars. On motion duly seconded the lease was ordered executed.

The street and alley committee reported that they did not believe that the proportions of sand gravel, and cement were sufficient in the street and alley crossings. On motion duly seconded they were instructed to confer with the town attorney, and if they find the ordinance defective, to prepare an amendment and present it at the next meeting.

On motion duly seconded the marshal was ordered to collect all water rents according to ordinance. If the water rents are not paid by the 10th of the month the water must be shut off. He was also ordered to make a canvass of the town and find out all who are using water and what they use it for.

On motion duly seconded the attorney was instructed to prepare an ordinance numbering all the lots in town, and that all owners be required to place numbers on their buildings.

No other business appearing the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.
