On Jan. 1 the postoffice department  
put into effect Order No. 907, contain-  
ing the following important amend-  
ment:

"A reasonable time will be allowed  
publishers to secure renewals of sub-  
scriptions, but unless subscriptions  
are expressly renewed after the term  
for which they are paid, within the  
following periods:  
Dailies, within three months; tri-  
weeklies, within six months; semi-  
weeklies, within nine months; week-  
lies, within one year; monthlies, with-  
in four months; bi-monthlies, within  
six months; quarterlies, within six  
months, they shall not be counted in  
the legitimate list of subscribers, and  
copies mailed on account thereof shall  
not be accepted for mailing at the  
second-class postage rate of one cent  
a pound, but be mailed at the trans-  
ient second-class postage rate of one  
cent for each four ounces or fraction  
thereof, prepaid by stamps affixed.  
The right of a publisher to extend  
credit for subscription to his publi-  
cation is not denied or questioned,  
but his compliance or noncompliance  
with this regulation will be taken in  
consideration in determining whether  
the publication is entitled to trans-  
mission at the second-class postage  
rate."

This means that the publisher of a  
weekly paper must pay a cent a copy  
upon every paper sent to subscribers  
who are delinquent for a year. There  
may be some publishers who are able  
to pay this excess postage, but the  
publisher of the Enterprise is not  
amongst them, and we would there-  
fore ask our subscribers to notice the  
date on the address slip of their pa-  
pers, and if it is not within the pre-  
sent year, you are asked to make it  
right during this month.

The Enterprise has a very good list  
of prompt-paying subscribers, but  
there are a few who have permitted  
their papers to become in arrears. To  
such we hope this gentle reminder  
will be sufficient.

### Convention Date Set

Lincoln's birthday, our new state hol-  
iday, was notable for the great gathering  
of Republicans at Denver, for the har-  
mony which prevailed, for the approval  
of President Roosevelt and for the en-  
dorsement of Secretary Taft for Presi-  
dent. At the same time a Republican  
State Editorial association was formed  
for the purpose of working in harmony  
with the party and its policies. A con-  
ference of county chairmen showed that  
the party was in admirable and growing  
condition.

A Lincoln's day banquet was held in  
the evening, 500 persons participating, at  
which Gov. Buchtel delivered a stirring  
address.

Tuesday, April 28, was selected as the  
date of the Republican state convention  
and Pueblo the place.

there will proceed to the schools, where  
exercises will be held under the direction  
of the following G. A. R. members:  
Liberty School—Minor, Sican, Blinn,  
Burr, Goff and Todd.  
Washington School—Chritton, Weist,  
Osborne, Love, Green and Hall.

### State Bank Affairs

Senator Swink, to whom was turned  
over the Fenton lands, is preparing to  
begin the pumping of water at an early  
date. A 60-horsepower engine has been  
installed since last season, and this will  
soon be at work supplying water. The  
early operation of the irrigating plant will  
do much to restore confidence and greatly  
help in making the Fenton property a  
valuable asset of the bank.

Attention is also being given the Shel-  
ton lands, which stand as security for  
\$7,000. They include much valuable  
land both below and above the ditch.
