ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF THE
BLACKBUCK MERCANTILE CO.
We the undersigned do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of Title 2, Chapter 24 of the General Statutes of the State of Minnesota, for 1894, and the Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and for that purpose do hereby make, sign and acknowledge these articles of incorporation as follows:

I. The name of this corporation shall be "Blackduck Mercantile Company". The general nature of the business of this corporation shall be the buying, selling and dealing in merchandise at wholesale and retail, and said corporation may acquire, hold and dispose of such real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary and expedient for the transaction of its business. The principal place of transacting the business of this corporation shall be Blackduck, Beltrami County, Minnesota, but the headquarters of this corporation shall be Bemidji, Minn.

II. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the First day of January, A. D. 1901, and the period of its continuance shall be for Thirty (30) years from that date.
III. The amount of Capital Stock of this corporation shall be Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, consisting of Three Hundred (300) shares of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each.
IV. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which said corporation shall at any time be subject shall be the sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars.
V. The names and residence of the persons forming this corporation are as follows: John A. Ludington, Bemidji, Minnesota; Lewis F. Parker, Blackduck, Minnesota.
VI. The affairs of said corporation shall be controlled by a board of three (3) directors, who shall choose and elect a general manager for the business of the corporation. The members of said board of directors shall be stockholders who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the stockholders of said corporation, which shall be held on the first Monday of January of each and every year. The first board of directors shall consist of William McQuig, John A. Ludington, and Lewis F. Parker, who shall hold their offices until the next annual meeting of this corporation in the year 1902, and until their successors are duly elected and qualified.
