## MORE COAL DISCOVERIES.

### A Report Made that Coal Has Been Found on the Little Fork.

In the last issue of the Laurel  
Free Press the following interest-  
ing item was published: "Wm.  
Ellie discovered coal on the Venus  
Island a mile below 20-mile rapids,  
the other day. Not particles or  
small signs, but an armful of big  
chunks which he brought to the  
townsite and burned. The coal was  
soft and burned well. It is Mr.  
Ellie's judgment that there is no  
coal on the island but that there is  
big bodies of it somewhere farther  
up the river, and the armful in  
question was 'bourned' to the island  
by the ice. It is doubtful if there is  
any man better posted on the re-  
sources of the Little Fork than Mr.  
Ellie and he is strongly of the  
opinion there is much coal up the  
river."

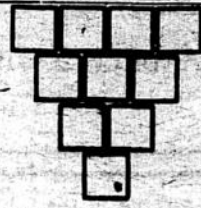

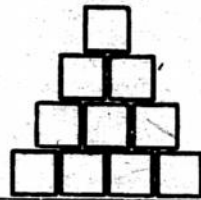
