Holdings of the Big Concern. The plants of the United States Steel corporation, owned and controlled by it Ian. 1st, 1906, consisted of ninety-three blast furnaces, sixteen Bessemer steel works, sixteen open-hearth steel works, seven Trail mills, thirty-eight sheet and tin plate mills, twenty-two bridge and structural plants, eighteen tube mills and a large number of other establishments, including bar mills, plate mills and wire, rod and mail mille. In addition to its manufacturing plants the corporation owns iron mines in the Lake Superior region having an annual output of 22,000,000 tons, a marine equipment operated in conjunction with the ore properties consisting of seventy steamers and thirty barges and seventy-three coking plants.
