Council Sends Committee to St. Paul in Interest of Amendment Makingli Special Assessments Collectable. At the council meeting Tuesday evening L. A. Marvin, deputy county auditor, was before the body and explained the amount of uncollected special assessments being carried by the city, the total at the present ime being \$7,27921, not including a list of about \$3,000 which was recenty sent to the auditor's office. The collection of those assess-

ments under the present law is almost an impossibility, as they do not become a tax lien for the sale of 1909 property, but simply lie in the aud itor's office to be cleaned up when a

ransfer of the property is made. Mr. Marvin suggested a remedy which met with approval, it being the introduction and passage of a bill making these assessments menable to the general law gov-

erning taxation and the council instructed Attorney Shea to draft Department of the Interior, U.S. Land Office such measure and appointed him and City Clerk Bickford to go to St. Paul to work for its introduction

and passage. The council by resolution declared against the "Public Utilities Bill" now pending before the legislature, above described, before Otto A. Poirler, U.
