Commissioner Carl T. Olson offered the following resolution in writing and moved its adoption:

Resolution of the Marshall County Board, appropriating funds for the construction of Federal Aid Project No. 1.

Be It Resolved, That the County Board of Marshall County, in session this 28th day of May does hereby make application for an allotment of \$10,000.00, from the Federal Aid funds of the State to aid in the construction and improvement of State Road No. 14 from S. W. Cor. Sec. 26, T. 155, R. 43 to E. 1/2 Cor. 26, T. 155, R. 39.

Be It Further Resolved, That upon Federal Aid being granted in the above amount by the Commissioner of Highways, subject to approval of the Secretary of Agriculture, the County Board does hereby agree to complete said project as a graveled road according to the requirements of the Commissioner of Highways and Secretary of Agriculture, the estimated cost of said improvement being \$90,000.00.

The County Board hereby agrees to provide necessary funds in addition to the Federal Aid by declaring bonds when available County Road and Bridge funds are insufficient.

Commissioner A. N. Lodoen seconded the motion and the question being put and the roll being called, the following voted in the affirmative: Commissioner A. N. Lodoen, Commissioner O. Eng, Commissioner Carl T. Olson, Commissioner Ole Torgerson.

The following voted in the negative: Commissioner A. S. D. Eng, Chairman County Board.

Be It Resolved, That the County Board go to St. Paul in body for the purpose of procuring trucks from the War Department.

Commissioner A. S. Rokke seconded the motion and the question being put and the roll being called, the following voted in the affirmative: Commissioner A. N. Lodoen, Commissioner O. Eng, Commissioner Carl T. Olson, Commissioner Ole Torgerson.

Commissioner A. N. Lodoen offered the following resolution in writing and moved its adoption:

Resolved, That the sum of \$1,000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General Revenue Fund to the Marshall County Agricultural Society, the said Society being a member of the State Agricultural Society.

Commissioner Ole Torgerson seconded the motion and the same being put received a majority of the votes of the members of the County Board and was duly carried and was by the Chairman, then presiding, declared.

Commissioner A. N. Lodoen offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

Resolved, That the sum of \$1,000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General Revenue Fund to the Marshall County, of the Minnesota War Records Commission, the same to be payable as follows, to-wit: \$300 forthwith; \$300 on September 1st, 1919, and \$400 on January 1st, 1920.

The said Local Committee in addition to carrying on the work for the State Commission shall prepare in type-written form duly bound in a permanent record, a service record of all Marshall County boys in the service of the United States Government during the World War, so far as the same may be obtainable by said Commission, and file the same with this Board when completed.




