CLIQUE MANIPULATION CAUSES THE STOCK TO DISPLAY A TIRED FEELING

LARGE DISTILLING SALES.

GRANGERS DISPLAY A SAMS-ONIAN DISPOSITION AND MAKE GAINS.

MARKET STEADY AT THE CLOSE.

Bond Transactions Light in Early Session, but Show Improvement at Close.

NEW YORK, May 23.—An improvement in the tone of speculation on the stock exchange was apparent at the opening of business this morning and prices advanced in the early dealings. Soon, however, a selling movement was developed in Distilling and it was rumored that a big pool in the stock was liquidating its holdings. Sugar and large offerings of large blocks of stock by clique manipulation was depressed, and in the hope, it is said, of reaching supporters at 10. The stock had risen 1/2 per cent to 11 1/2 in the morning, and was sold down to 11, with the effect of bringing out heavy blocks of stocks. The sales of Distilling were an unusually large sale, and caused a decline in the stock of 1/2 per cent before noon. In the afternoon there was a rally of 1/4, but in the final dealings there was a reaction, and the stock closed at 10 1/2.
